Bill McGee – Financial Management Update & Appeal

We have been asked to give our financial position now and a year-end estimate. This is based on information to the end of October in our Operating Fund.

Year-to-date October 2022 Estimated Year-end 2022 Budget 2022

Expenses \$365,700 \$432,700 \$471,541 Revenues \$338,600 \$418,600 \$442,700

We estimate a deficit of about 4 percent. Expenses are slightly below budget because committee spending has been kept in check. Oil cost is much higher, but electricity expense is lower than expected. And the Envelope Givings are only about 75 percent of that predicted in the budget, but are increasing as Church attendance increases. Room rentals have had a banner year, and are double to triple that budgeted during the pandemic. Securities donations are expected to be lower because of market conditions. But, if you are able to increase your givings by 10 percent for the rest of the year, we expect to enter 2023 in reasonable financial shape. This will enable Bells Corners United Church to continue to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ here and elsewhere.
