**St. Basil's Church Presentation:** The gap between Christian faith and everyday life was already observed during the Second Vatican Council and has only increased during the last six decades. Some would suggest that the faith-life gap has grown exponentially even while work goes on in many ways to address it.

Since 2018, Dr. Carol Kuzmochka has been the lead researcher for an *Action Research Project in Adult Faith Education in Canada* exploring the gap between faith and life and searching for practices in Adult Faith Education/Accompaniment that bridge it.

In this interactive webinar, she will share the wisdom that is arising in this qualitative research and invite participants to discussion and reflection about the practical implications and their relevance for a Synodal Church. This event had originally been planned for October 16 but had to be postponed to **October 23**.
