# **Quarterly Financial Report to BCUC Congregation – Quarter ending September 30, 2023**

As this is the end of the third quarter, the target numbers are at 75%. Thanks to the continued generosity of members of the church total revenue to the end of September was \$ \$291,917 which represents 61% of budgeted revenue, slightly off target. Envelope givings are at 46% of projected, similar to last year, PAR givings sit at 74%. Rental income continues to do well at 70%. Even though we have no one on Sundays selling Loblaws and other gift cards, that income has already reached 90% of goal.

The continued endeavour of committees to keep expenses at a minimum led to total expenses at 69% of target, so we are holding the line on our expenses as was the case last year. We continue to meet our commitments in support and service.

The electronic sign fund has reached its target and the project is proceeding. The budget for this year projected a \$20,000 deficit. The current deficit is \$50,000. Securities donations and the Christmas Bazaar will help reduce that. I am confident we will be able to come close to balancing the budget by year end. If you are able, a top up of 10% of your pledged givings for November and December would help reach that goal. Your continued support of BCUC is greatly appreciated and allows us to make a difference.


