Announcing the 2023 Advent Project

The SOSA committee has chosen the **Mission & Service Fund** for the 2023 Advent Project. A recent article in the December *Broadview* announced that "United Church Cutting Partnership Grants to Balance Its 2024 Budget". According to the article \$60,000 will be cut to our Eastern Ontario and Outaouais Regional Council (EOORC) along with reductions in grants to other Canadian and global partners. These grants made to EOORC come from the Mission and Service Fund of the United Church and are used to support local projects such as Ottawa West End Community Chaplaincy and Centre 507. The M&S fund is very important for our church family as 69% of the M&S Funds are spent within Canada. We encourage you to make a flow-through donation to the M&S Fund either by an e-transfer to BCUC with M&S Fund in the message line, or a cheque to the office marked for 'Mission and Service Fund'.

HEALTH CONCERNS: We are again in the flu season and the rising number of cases of COVID is a concern that we do not want to ignore. FAMSAC began over 50 years ago to help families in need at Christmas with hampers. Today, FAMSAC provides emergency food support to about 150 families every month from our new permanent home at Hollyer House. Demand has been steadily growing in the past few years with a new record in terms of the number of food orders we provide and the number of people requesting assistance through our Christmas program. In 2022 we provided assistance to more than 300 families at Christmas and expect to surpass that record once again in 2023.

Donations help fund our Christmas gift card program, which, during the pandemic replaced our Christmas hamper program. While much more expensive, this offers families the freedom to purchase food items that suit their needs. We remain very grateful for the financial support that so many churches, businesses, community groups and individuals provide.
