Quarterly Financial Report to BCUC Congregation – Quarter ending March 31,

2024: As this is the end of the first quarter, the target numbers are at 25%. Thanks to the continued generosity of members of the church total revenue to the end of March was \$ \$97,200 which represents 20% of budgeted revenue, somewhat off target but actually a slight improvement compared to last year. Envelope givings are at 20% of projected, an improvement from last year, PAR givings sit at 26%. Rental income continues to do well at 27%. Loblaws and other gift cards income is already at 51% of goal. Events is only at 5% as we have not yet had the garage sale.

The continued endeavour of committees to keep expenses at a minimum led to total expenses at 24% of target, so we are holding the line on our expenses as was the case last year. We continue to meet our commitments in support and service.

The budget for this year projected a \$28,000 deficit. The current deficit is \$26,300. Securities donations and the Christmas Fair will help reduce that. We need to work at reducing that deficit so we end the year with a balanced budget. Your continued support of BCUC is greatly appreciated and allows us to make a difference. - Ross Mutton, Treasurer

What does nonbinary mean?

"Nonbinary" is a term used to describe genders that don't fall into one of the two categories traditionally recognized by our society. Other terms include genderqueer, agender, bigender, genderfluid, etc. These words vary in their meanings, but all describe an experience of gender that is not simply male or female (or man/woman). Although the concept may be new to some of us, nonbinary gender identities have been recognized by many other cultures and societies for thousands of years.

There are many ways to be nonbinary. Some nonbinary people have a gender identity that blends elements of being a man or a woman. Some people identify as a different gender that is neither man nor woman and some don't identify with any gender. There are also people whose gender changes over time. The best way to understand what it means to be nonbinary is to get to know people as individuals.

Come discover **Shape Note Singing** on **Sunday May 12** in the Music Room. We sing from 2-4:30 pm with a break. (bring your own mug, please, tea will be available). Shape Note singing is a centuries old tradition of 4 part harmony hymn singing designed to help people learn to read music in the true community singing tradition, all are welcome.
