Child Development in Families with Sexual Minority Parents

The number of children in families with parents who are members of sexual minorities (2SLGBTQIA+) has increased. Although public attitudes towards sexual minorities have improved, sexual minority parenting remains a controversial topic around the world.

A major review of studies on this topic (from 1989 to 2022) has concluded that parents' sexual orientation is not an important determinant of children's development. In countries where same-sex relationships are legalised, most family outcomes are similar between sexual minority and heterosexual families, and sexual minority families have even better outcomes in some domains.

The review notes that community climate and social support have an important impact on the health and well-being of sexual minority families who may experience some additional stressors related to their sexual minority status. The authors recommend more research into how governments and communities can support sexual minority families.
